Pastor's Letter for November 2018

Sisters and brothers in Christ, Peace be with you!

For all your saints, O Lord, who strive in you to live, who followed you, obeyed, adored, our grateful hymn receive.

On November 4, 2018, we will gather to celebrate the Holy Eucharist and to remember those saints who have gone before us and now rest in certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life. <u>All Saints</u> <u>Sunday</u> is our celebration of the promise of eternity granted to those who have died in faith.

We, as Lutheran Christians, don't always feel comfortable talking about saints. And yet as Luther reminded us: **we are both saint and sinner**. While we are living in a state of sin as human beings, we are also, at the same time, **saints** – beloved by God and promised life eternal. Through the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are sainted and made whole and new.

To gather together to remember those who have died before us is a special time for us all. We recall those most beloved to us whose lives touched us and, in many cases, formed us into the persons we are today. We don't reverence these saints as perfect or as super human, but we do lift them up as examples of lives lived well and lives lived in faith. We are thankful to God for them.

In our funeral liturgy the opening prayer speaks this:

O God of grace and glory, we remember before you today our *sister or brother*. We thank you for giving her/him to know and to love as a companion in our pilgrimage on earth. In your boundless compassion, console us who mourn. Give us faith to see that death has been swallowed up in the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we may live in confidence and hope, until by your call, we are gathered to our heavenly home in the company of all your saints; through Jesus

Holiday Opportunities!

Can you believe it??!! Thanksgiving and Christmas are coming soon. Food, gifts, families, and friends are in our thoughts. Our households also often look for opportunities to make the holidays special for those who might not have as many resources as ourselves. Here at St. Paul we have traditionally offered some options that may be just the ticket for your holiday giving.

- **Holiday Baskets** We can support the **Calhan Pantry** by donating money for food for those who qualify for help to put holiday meals on their tables for their families at Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- Toys The pantry accepts applications from families with **children up to age 12** who could use help in putting gifts for their kiddos under the tree. We can bring toys in new (or virtually new) condition for our Pantry Toy Box for children (and/or donate cash for the Pantry to do the toy shopping) and brighten young faces at Christmas.
- Angel-Angel Not to be forgotten are teens ages 13 to 18 who qualify to submit a small Christmas wish list for your shopping adventure. This gifting possibility for you shows up on the Christmas tree in the narthex each year with angel tags you can take and be an angel to these teen angels who also apply through the Pantry.
- Senior Christmas Store Our relationship with the Good Samaritan Home in Simla continues through the year with monthly worship and an annual Christmas Store. Our members have generously given items for the residents at Good Samaritan to Christmas "shop" for themselves or someone special in their lives. When they ask how much they have to pay they are told the cost to the residents is nothing, though a sweet smile, a warm hug, or a glad heart is always accepted.
- ELCA Good Gifts Similar to the Heifer Project is the ELCA's Good Gifts program. We highlight this program after you empty the Angel-Angel tree with gifting suggestions that range from bees and chicks to garden tools and immunizations; from sheep and pigs to tuition and education supplies; from micro-loans for women to wells and garden watering systems and much more. For those on your list who have everything they want or need, a Good Gift in their name or in honor of grandchildren or in memory of loved ones can be a treasured present at Christmas (or anytime).
- **Your Special Charity** and of course you have other ways and places to give not listed here that are blessed and important as well.

More details will be coming, but the Social Ministry Commission wanted to give you a heads-up.
